Dear Tax-Exempt Filer:

Because most exempt organizations use computers to prepare and print their returns, we are not sending you a tax package to save the cost of printing and mailing. If you need forms, instructions, or other tax products, see *How To Get Tax Products* below.

IMPORTANT: For tax year 2010, most exempt organizations may file:

- Form 990-EZ instead of Form 990, if they have gross receipts less than \$200,000 and total assets less than \$500,000 (except for private foundations);
- Form 990-N (e-postcard) instead of Form 990 or 990-EZ, if they have gross receipts normally less than \$50,000 (except for private foundations, section 509(a)(3) supporting organizations, or section 527 political organizations).
- All private foundations must file Form 990-PF. They are not eligible to file Form 990, Form 990-EZ or Form 990-N.
